POSITION SUMMARY

The Research Fellow will undertake research examining social dimensions of healthcare, with a focus on social interaction. The Research Fellow will primarily work on the project Understanding communication about advance care planning across the lifespan, funded by the Australian Research Council (reference: DP240100072), working under the broad direction of the Chief Investigator.

In working with the Chief Investigator and research team, the Research Fellow will bring advanced research skills, including project management, fieldwork using video recording equipment to generate data, conversation analytic skills, and experience in disseminating and translating research findings. The Research Fellow will actively report on new and current research related to the broad program of research that this project comprises, through generation of high quality publications and conference presentations. In addition, the Research Fellow will contribute to the preparation of applications for externally funded research funding that build on the current project.

- Independently contributing to ethical, high quality and innovative research and evaluation through activities such as scholarship, publishing in recognised high quality journals and assisting the preparation and submission of bids for external research funding.
- Undertake day-to-day fieldwork data collection at Children's Health Queensland and Metro South Hospital and Health Services in Brisbane.
- Perform data management activities including review, data collection and data analysis, applying advanced conversation analytic expertise to these tasks.
- Supervision of honours and post graduate research projects.
- Establishing and maintaining collaborations within the University, and at State, national and international levels in order to improve research outputs, patents and publications.
- Lead the development of reports and produce manuscripts suitable for publication in high quality journals.
- Prepare timely progress and final research draft reports for the project.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues and industry partners.
- Participate in the supervision of postgraduate students.
- · Contribute to knowledge translation activities arising from the project.
- Implement and administer University and other relevant policies relating to research governance, ethical conduct of research, and workplace health and safety.
- Some out of hours work (including weekends) as well as rural, interstate and overseas travel to project sites around Australia (e.g., Brisbane, Sydney, and Adelaide).

At least for the duration of the fieldwork component of the project, this position involves working remotely from Flinders University campuses. During this time, the appointee will need to be based in Brisbane. A suitable working environment will be negotiated with the appointee and Brisbane institutions collaborating on the project

- Demonstrated excellent communication and leadership skills with demonstrated ability to work collaboratively and maintain effective working relationships with project members and stakeholders.
- Demonstrated record of relevant publications in major international journals and other dissemination of research outcomes such as reports, submissions, conference papers, journal articles and peer-review articles
- Demonstrated digital literacy skills, including the use of Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, Excel, EndNote, and conversation analytic research software (e.g., ELAN).
- Demonstrated experience delivering project targets on time.
- Demonstrated ability to critically review the literature in relevant fields.
- Demonstrated excellent oral and written communication skills in an academic environment.
