### **POSITION SUMMARY**

The Research Fellow will undertake a range of research, evaluation, consultancy and education activities under the broad direction of the Director at the National Centre for Education and Training on Addiction (NCETA). NCETA is an internationally recognised Research Centre that works as a catalyst for change in the alcohol and other drugs field. A collaborative venture between Flinders University and the Australian Government Department of Health, NCETA is located within the College of Medicine and Public Health and is part of the Flinders Health and Medical Research Institute (FHMRI) at Flinders University in South Australia. NCETA is a key national research centre in the alcohol and other drug field. The Centre works to reduce the harms from alcohol and other drugs from prevention through to treatment. A key focus of the Centre is workforce development (WFD).

The Research Fellow will undertake a range of research activities including oversight of the Centre's research projects, data collections/datasets and providing statistical analysis and advice across various NCETA projects. The Research Fellow is also required to assist with: the development and conduct of surveys; systematic reviews; the production of high quality research proposals, reports and peer-reviewed publications. In addition, the Research Fellow, NCETA will contribute to the development of grant applications for externally funded research funding. The Research Fellow may also be required to supervise honours graduate and post-graduate students research projects and deliver guest lectures.

- Undertaking comprehensive literature searches including systematic reviews of published and grey literature.
- Independently contributing to ethical, high quality and innovative research and evaluation through
  activities such as scholarship, publishing in recognised high quality journals and assisting the
  preparation and submission of bids for external research funding.
- Developing and contributing to the development of research proposals, tenders and grant applications.
- Preparing project reports, and peer-reviewed papers, and other complex documents as required.
- Independently contributing to the planning and execution of research by offering new and innovative ideas, reviewing relevant literature and other sources of information, actively participating in the production of data, contributing to the writing and editing of grant applications and disseminating the Centre's research findings via conference, seminar and workshop presentations.
- Playing a lead role in project management including coordinating, planning and executing project tasks
  and preparing project reports and other complex documents required to successfully deliver project
  milestones and meet Key Performance Indicators, including those set by external funders.
- Supervision of research assistants and student research projects (including undergraduate, honours and post-graduate students) and undertaking guest lectures
- Establishing and maintaining collaborations within the University, and with academic and nonacademic partners at State, national and international levels in order to improve research outputs and publications.
- Some out of hours work (including weekends) as well as rural SA, interstate and overseas travel, may be required.
- Any other responsibilities in line with the level of the position as assigned by the Supervisor and/or the University.

- 9. Self-motivation and ability to work under limited supervision

### **POSITION SUMMARY**

The Senior Research Fellow will take a lead role in developing, managing and implementing research and evaluation projects, expanding the College's research activities within NCETA through the attraction of external grants and research contracts and delivering on strategic research objectives. The role will also be responsible for establishing and maintaining industry and research partnerships, identifying commercially relevant outputs, and building the University's national and international reputation through high quality publications and strong research collaborations.

The position will work collaboratively with other members of NCETA, FHMRI, and external partners.

- Being actively involved in strategic planning and professional activities relevant to the promotion of research and in identifying opportunities to expand and grow research activity.
- Actively leading and managing a team of Research Fellows and Research Assistants, as well as supervising and mentoring Higher Degree by Research students.
- Playing a lead role in project management including coordinating and planning project tasks and overseeing
  project tasks and reporting to successfully deliver project milestones and meet Key Performance Indicators,
  including those set by external funders.
- Developing and maintaining, in a leadership capacity, productive and strategic local, national and international relationships, collaborations and networks with a range of stakeholders including industry, government and other external organisations.
- Making a significant contribution, in a leadership capacity, to the management and administration of research in the College, with the ability to undertake delegated authority on behalf of the Director, NCETA.

- Demonstrated track record of supervision of honours and/or higher degree students.
- Demonstrated ability to develop and maintain effective research collaborations within the university and wider community including with industry, government and other organisations.

- Demonstrated ability to use independent judgement and initiative, under minimal supervision, to manage, organise and coordinate activities required for the functioning of a research-intensive unit.
