POSITION SUMMARY

Under broad direction, the Counsellor, as a member of a multi-disciplinary team, will provide counselling services to students, with a specific focus on providing specialist support and counselling to students who have experienced gender-based violence. The Counsellor will also participate in the development and delivery of group programs and other initiatives for students. Additionally, the Counsellor will provide advice and training to university staff to promote student wellbeing, particularly focusing on the gender-based prevention of and response to gender-based violence.

UNIVERSITY EXPECTATIONS AND VALUES

All staff at Flinders are responsible for understanding their obligations and responsibilities as set out in the University's code of conduct and are expected to:

KEY POSITION RESPONSIBILITIES

The Counsellor is accountable for:

- 1. Providing specialist counselling and support services to students who have experienced gender-based violence, including case management to ensure students are supported through any reporting or complaints processes and linked with any relevant specialist support services.
- 2. Providing subject matter expertise on gender-based violence to the Counselling Service.
- **3.** Advising and consulting with other University staff, both professional and academic, on matters relating to prevention and response to gender-based violence.
- **4.** Providing training and education to University staff regarding gender-based violence, wellbeing and supporting students with mental health issues.
- **5.** Providing professional counselling services to students experiencing issues that are impacting their wellbeing including academic, personal or mental health issues. This includes intake and assessment, crisis intervention and brief solution-focused interventions.
- **6.** Providing support and assistance with academic progress issues including advice regarding University policies and procedures and liaison with other University staff, both academic and professional as appropriate.
- **7.** Promoting student wellbeing and safety through the development and delivery of a range of activities and programs such as group and training programs.
- 8. Some out of hours, weekend and travel may be required.
- **9.** Any other responsibilities in line with the level of the position as assigned by the Supervisor and/or the University.

KEY POSITION CAPABILITIES

- Registration as a Psychologist with the Psychological Board of Australia or eligibility for membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers and postgraduate experience.
- Demonstrated experience providing specialist gender-based violence counselling services, including intake and assessment, crisis intervention, solution focused counselling and case management support, to a diverse client group.
- Demonstrated specialised experience and knowledge working in the areas of gender-based violence, particularly sexual violence prevention and response.
- Demonstrated experience in developing, delivering and evaluating effective group training programs with a focus on student safety and wellbeing.
- High-level written and oral communication skills, including the ability to produce written information and presentations.
- Highly developed interpersonal and problem-solving skills, including the ability to effectively liaise with students, colleagues and manage stakeholders with competing demands.
- High-level analytical skills and demonstrated experience solving complex problems requiring strategic thought and independent judgement.
- Demonstrated understanding of the higher education sector and factors that impact on student wellbeing (desirable).
