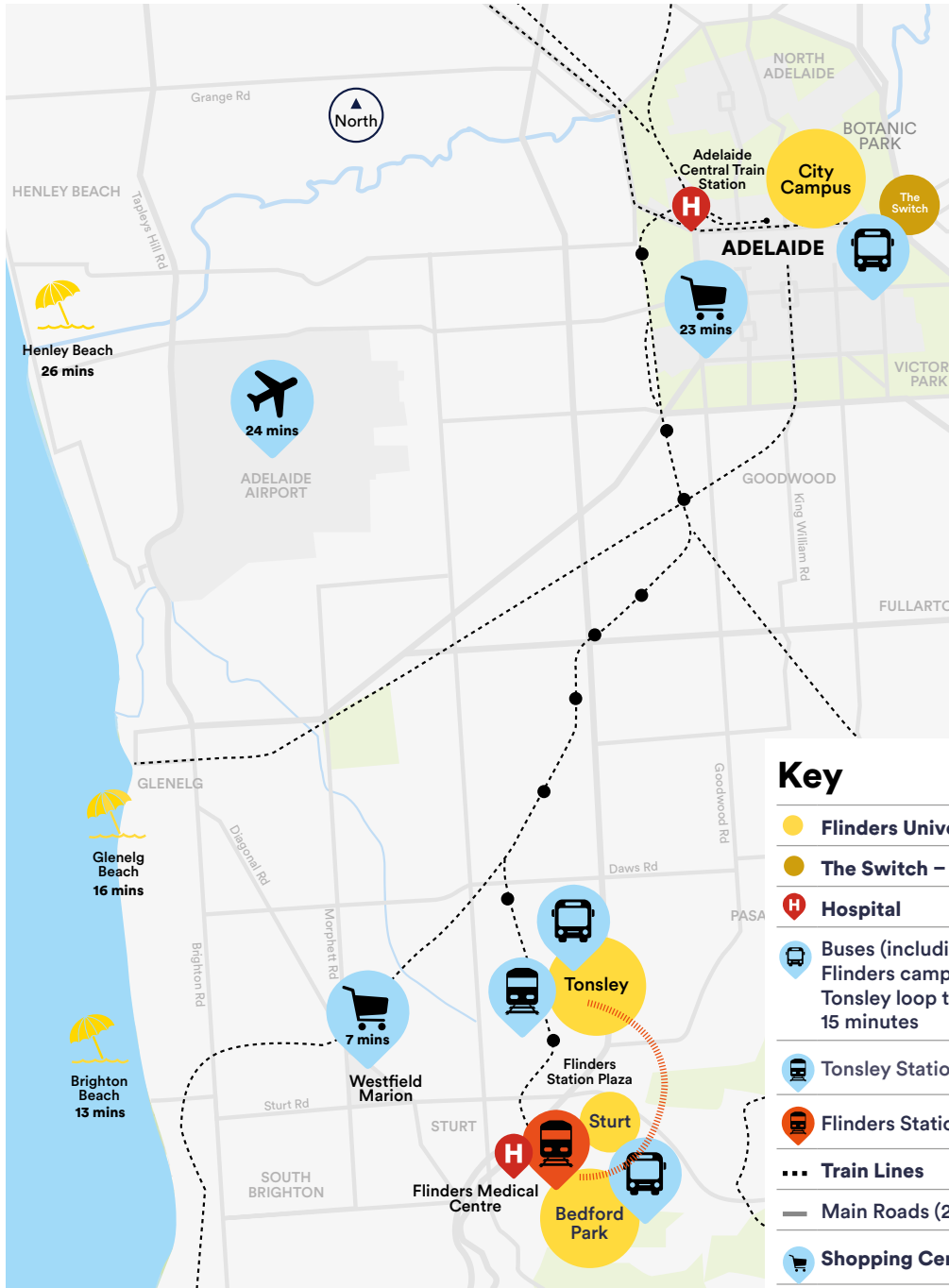

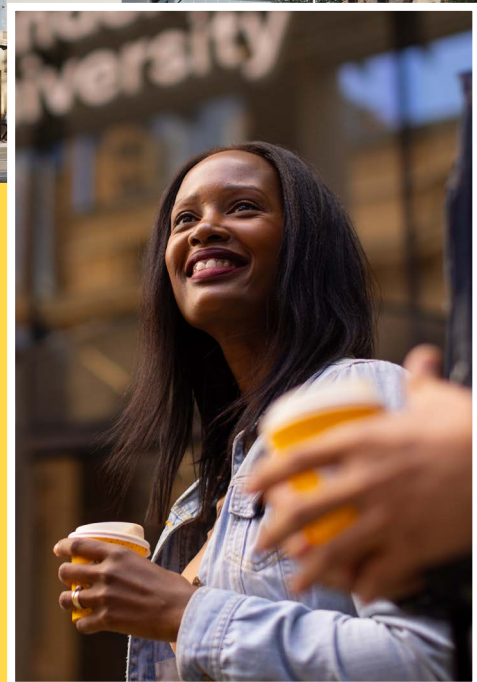

Centred around the new Flinders Station, the \$1.5 billion Flinders Village development will create a campus environment that merges university life with the wider community.

Flinders Village will feature student accommodation, an advanced Health and Medical Research Building, transitional health accommodation, a hotel and amenities such as retail facilities, benefitting students, staff and the community.

Flinders Station links Bedford Park to Tonsley and the city in just 22 minutes.

Creating a substantial increase in the quantity, quality and choice of on-campus living facilities, Flinders Village will see an active day-and-night culture in high-quality public spaces, ensuring a sense of safety and connection, with students able to participate in Village life around the clock.

The location and layout of the new student accommodation development is also designed to provide connectivity between our precincts – with picturesque pedestrian routes connecting our central campus to the Village square.

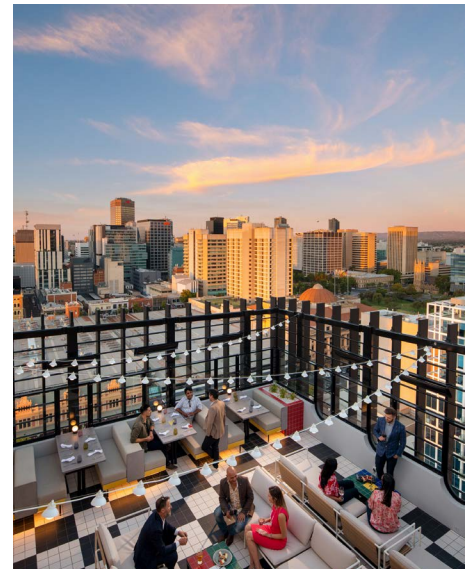

An 'Aussie' experience

Getting around

Adelaide is very easy to explore. You'll quickly discover that the city is well serviced by public transport, and as an international student, you'll receive the same transport concessions as local students, saving you up to \$700 per year on transport costs. Free tram and bus services run in the Adelaide city centre.

Buses run frequently to and from Flinders University and the adjacent Flinders Medical Centre, with various routes running directly from the city and suburbs. Now open, the \$141 million extension of the Tonsley rail line and creation of a new station links Flinders Bedford Park and Tonsley campuses by rail, allowing Flinders students to access the CBD by train in 22 minutes. Adelaide is also cycling-friendly, with a large community of cyclists and dedicated bike lanes.

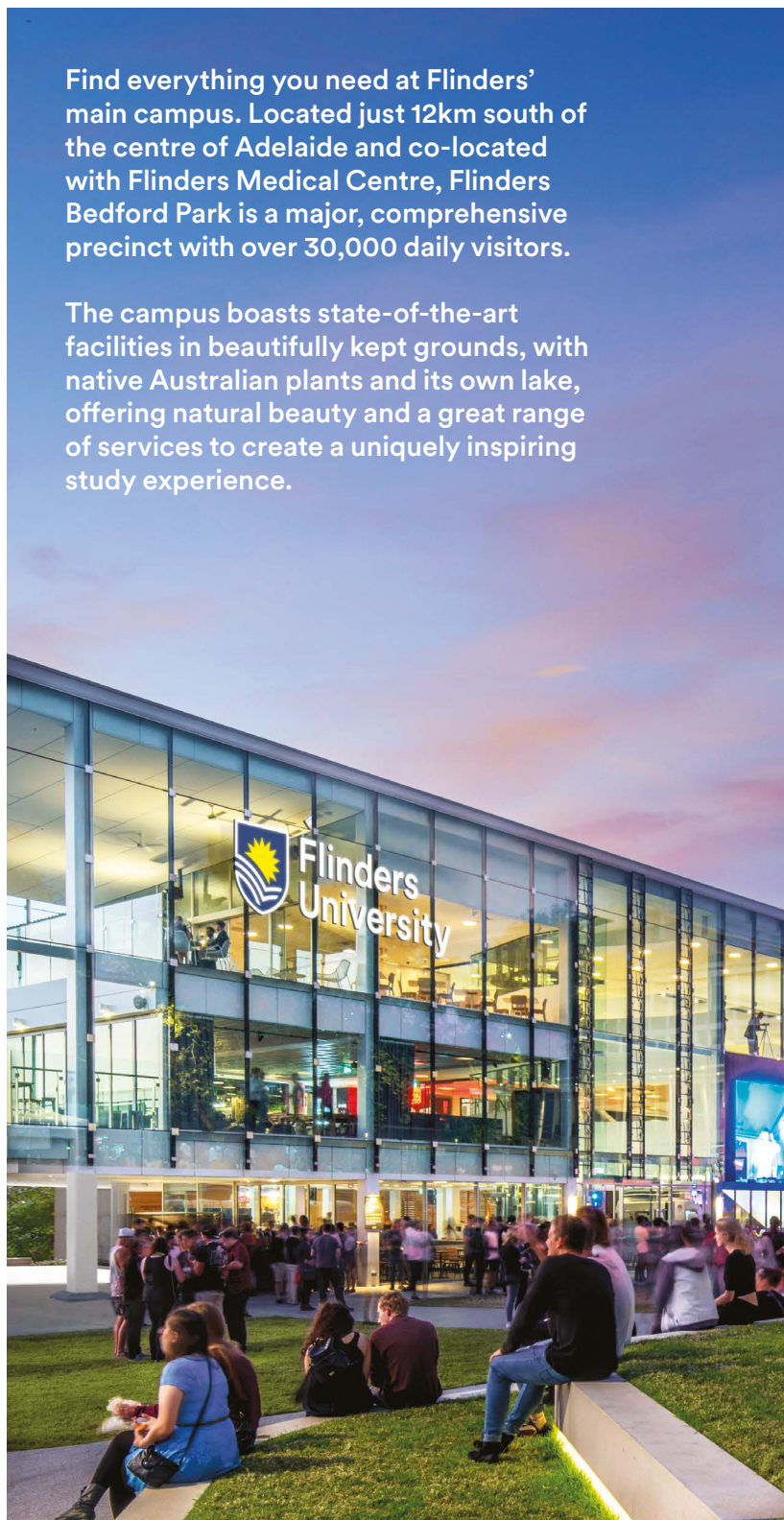

Explore Flinders' Tonsley campus: a \$120 million centre of innovation. It's a place where collaboration and entrepreneurial spirit combine to create the products and processes of the 21st century.

With more than 150 staff, 2,000 students – and a 2,000 square metre pod for heavy engineering equipment – Tonsley centrally locates the University's teaching and research in computer science, engineering and mathematics.

The New Venture Institute (NVI), based at Tonsley, links businesses, government and the community sector to all that the University has to offer.


Through their programs and activities, NVI inspires, educates and connects students like you: the future generation of innovators and entrepreneurs.

Flinders at Tonsley has strong connections to industry. The centre is also home to local and international businesses, including industrial manufacturing company Siemens.

Flinders Partners, the Medical Device Research Institute, Flinders Centre for Nanoscale Science and Technology, and Factory of the Future – Australia's first large-scale advanced manufacturing accelerator – are also located at Tonsley.

Indonesian Secondary School Certificate of Graduation (SKHUN/STK) or Secondary School Certificate of Completion (Ijazah, previously STTB). A pass is an average of 6.0 out of 10 with at least 4.26 in each subject (previously 3.0). Grades from the student's final year of study are shown separately on their school report.

Malaysia STPM

STPM calculation A or A-=5pts; B+=4; B=3; B- or C+=2; C=1. Add the points scored for best of three courses attempted at one examination, excluding General Paper.

Malaysia UEC

UEC scores are obtained by calculating the best five subjects as follows: A1=1, A2=2, B3=3, B4=4, B5=5, B6=6, C7=7, C8=8. Language studies and the topic General Paper are excluded in the calculation.

Gaokao entry requirements

This table sets out the Gaokao scores, correct at time of printing, that are required for entry to most of the undergraduate courses at Flinders University. On meeting the required Gaokao score, applicants must also satisfy any course prerequisites and must meet the English language requirements of each individual course.

Gaokao applications will undergo the standard assessment process and must include the following documents:

- certified evidence of the official result issued by Academy of Education Recruitment and Examination in both Chinese and English translation identifying the stream students have taken in the examination
- certified Senior Middle School graduation certificate and transcript in both Chinese and English.

English language entry requirements

For applicants whose first language is not English you will need to have:

- achieved the required test score for your course as listed in the course index on page 50. Test results for most courses must be no more than two years old from the proposed date of commencement of the course; or
- successfully completed an approved tertiary qualification taught in Australia, Canada, Ireland, New Zealand, South Africa, the USA or the UK, with evidence no more than five years old on the proposed date of commencement for most courses; or
- successfully completed a pre-course English program from an approved ELICOS provider (evidence of completion must be no more than two years old on the proposed date of commencement for most courses).

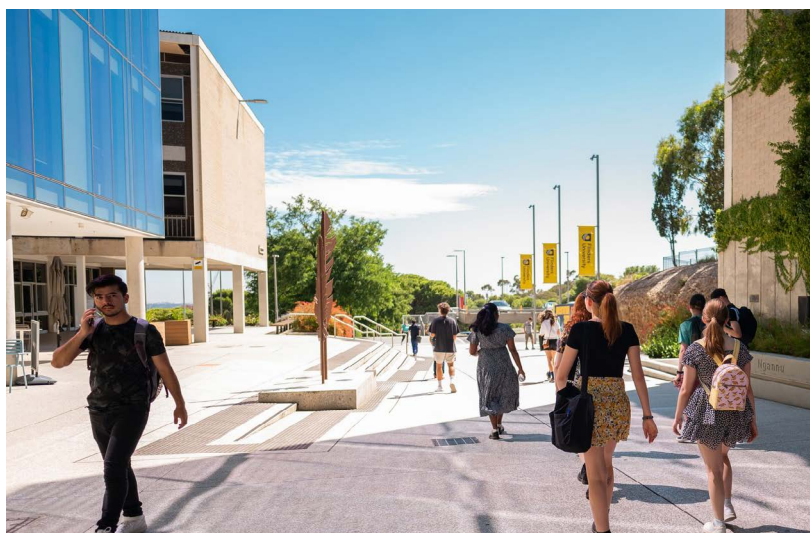

Admission process

Admission to Flinders University is a simple four-step process.

Your application

Submit your application, making sure you include all the required supporting documents as attachments. We will send you an acknowledgment and advise you if any further information or documentation is required.

Your offer of admission

Your offer of admission will be sent to you by email. We will endeavour to send your offer letter as soon as possible once your application is complete; however, there may be delays where you have applied for a course with strict quotas or additional entry requirements apply, or where credit/exemption is sought for previous study.

Your offer of admission will include details on how to accept your offer by completing the Offer Acceptance form and associated declarations. You will also be required to pay the relevant tuition fees for the first semester and the Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your student visa as detailed in your offer of admission.

Ensure you read your offer of admission letter carefully as it may include important deadlines for accepting your offer or deadlines for payment of fees to secure your place in the course.

Confirmation of enrolment

We will issue the Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) upon receipt of the signed acceptance, review of the declaration(s) and payment of fees including OSHC. With the CoE you can apply for your student visa. Please check your visa requirements at homeaffairs.gov.au
