Speech Pathologists work with people whose educational, vocational, personal and social functioning is affected by communication or swallowing impairment resulting from developmental difficulties, social disadvantage, illness or accident.

Speech Pathology graduates are employed within both public and private healthcare providers and work with people of all ages.

Bachelor of Health Sciences / Master of Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapists evaluate and identify barriers to people participating in the activities that matter to them. They then work with people to improve their skills and abilities, change the way they do an activity, or modify their environment, to help them live their best lives. This helps contribute to their overall psychological and physical wellbeing.

Occupational Therapy graduates are employed within both public and private healthcare providers and work with people of all ages.

Bachelor of Health Sciences / Master of Physiotherapy

Physiotherapists bring together expertise in a range of body systems. They work to assess and manage people with musculoskeletal, cardiovascular, respiratory or neurological impairments and conditions, to help them move well, stay well and live full lives.

Physiotherapy graduates are employed across a broad range of healthcare settings in both public and private sectors.

Master of Audiology

The Master of Audiology is a professionally oriented course for graduates interested in acquiring knowledge and skills in the evaluation and management of auditory disorders (hearing loss and tinnitus) and their consequences.

This course prepares you to become a well-informed health professional and begin clinical practice as an audiologist in urban, rural, and remote settings. Additionally, the course will help you acquire critical skills in appraising scientific and clinical information which will assist your further professional development.
