History and Standing

Flinders University has been teaching medicine for 50 years, beginning with our first intake of undergraduate medical students in 1974, followed by the opening of Flinders Medical Centre. We were the first in Australia to offer a graduate entry medical course in 1996, and for the past 12 years, we've proudly taught medicine in Darwin, graduating 186 doctors to date.

Status

Our Flinders Medical Program is recognised nationally and internationally for its innovative curriculum, now used by other schools in Australia and overseas.

Clinical Exposure

Throughout this degree, you will have many unique clinical education options and be part of rotations in health delivery in rural and remote communities. The program is based at Casuarina Campus and the Royal Darwin Hospital, Alice Springs and Katherine Hospitals, with outreach to general practices and community clinics across the Northern Territory (NT).

Doctor of Medicine (MD) Graduate Entry | Duration: 4 years

The Flinders University graduate entry MD combines leading academic and clinical education practices and experiences to deliver its highly respected medical program. The first 2 years of the program are for students to develop strong foundations in clinical sciences, pathophysiology, communication and clinical procedural skills prior to undertaking the more clinically focused final years. The final years you will work alongside practicing clinicians in a variety of health settings.

To help medical students to become competent professionals and improve their learning, first year students are allocated a Learning Coach, who provide individualised coaching and support. Coaching occurs during one-on-one meetings with students at various stages throughout their four-year MD program.
